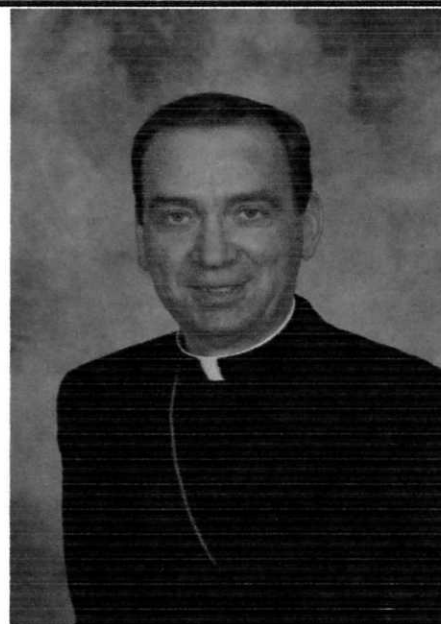
Prayer Chain

Welcome Archbishop Schnurr

On Monday, Dec. 21 Most Rev. Dennis M. Schnurr, the coadjutor Archbishop of Cincinnati, succeeded the Most Rev. Daniel Pilarczyk, becoming the 10th ordinary (presiding bishop) of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, since it's founding in 1821.

This follows the acceptance by Pope Benedict XVI effective Dec. 21 of Archbishop Pilarczyk resignation, as all bishops are required to do on their 75th birthday. He had been Archbishop for 27 years, longer than any other currently serving Archbishop in the United States.

Archbishop Schnurr said, "One year ago, when Pope Benedict XVI appointed me coadjutor of Cincinnati, I was humbled and honored. Today, after having had the opportunity to visit so many of our parishes, schools and other institutions over the past months, I feel even more grateful and privileged. The welcome has been overwhelming and I look forward to working with our priests, deacons, religious and lay people in building upon the solid foundation of faith that is so evident in our communities."

Archbishop Schnurr, age 61, brings to the leadership of Cincinnati a distinguished background as a canon lawyer, diocesan administrator, member of the papal nuncio's staff, organizer of the 1st World Youth Day and general secretary of the U.S. Conference of Bishops.

Archbishop Pilarczyk, born in Dayton, will continue to live in Cincinnati, assisting Archbishop Schnurr in a variety of needs. Archbishop Pilarczyk said, "The Archdiocese of Cincinnati is blessed to be getting such a skilled, dedicated and spiritual pastor, "FLOREAT", which in Latin means, "May he flourish".

The Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Cincinnati is the 26th largest Catholic diocese in the country. It has almost 500,000 Catholics & has the 8th largest number of Catholic schools in terms of enrollment. It includes 218 parishes and 113 Catholic grade and high schools.
