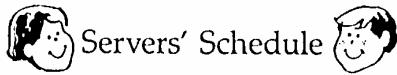

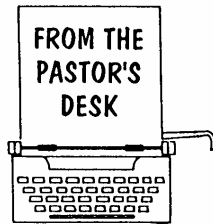


**C****NFIRMATION**

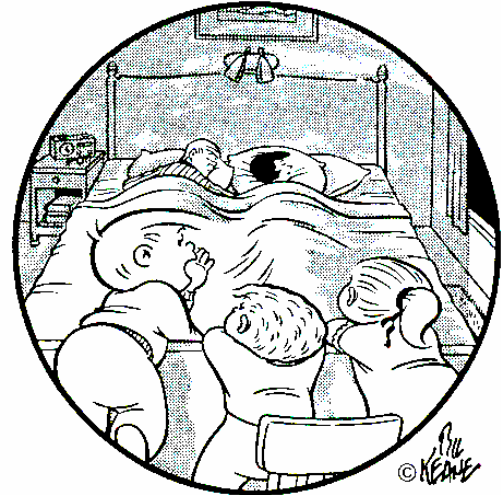

### **Reflection on this weekend's Scripture Readings**

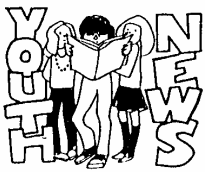

### **Theology of the Body**

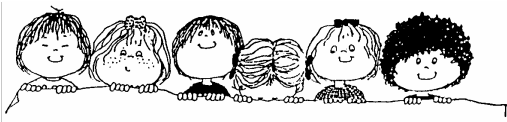

**2012-2013 Priority School Registration**

for St. Teresa Parishioners for kindergarten, new students & returning students begins Feb. 6. Registration forms for students currently in St. Teresa School will be sent home Feb. 6 and need to be returned with registration fee and technology fee by Feb. 24<sup>th</sup>. If registration forms are received after Feb 25, you are not guaranteed a spot, if a waiting list for a grade should occur. **Registration for new students** may be requested by calling the school at 471-4530 or stop by the school office. Registration will not be official until all fees and paperwork have been returned.

**We try to keep tuition as low as possible, so any child of a parishioner can attend St. Teresa School.** Pastoral Council, Finance and Education Commissions are recommending a \$ 100.00 per student tuition increase for the 2012-13 school year. This is less than other parishes and requires the parish general fund to make up tuition shortfalls. For anyone with financial difficulties, the parish tries to provide as much tuition assistance as possible. Tuition assistance forms are in the school office.

All St. Teresa School Graduates are eligible for the **Vogel Scholarship Fund**. Each year this fund distributes \$ 100,000.00 to students attending Elder, Seton, St. Xavier and Mother of Mercy High Schools and to Xavier University & Mount St. Joseph College. Vogel Application forms are in the parish, school offices and on line at [www.stteresa.net](http://www.stteresa.net). They must be returned to the parish or school office by March 5<sup>th</sup>.

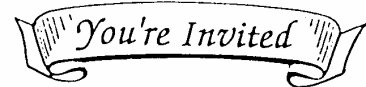
